Steps from the buzzing financial district and the gourmet paradise of the Zona G, Casa Medina is an urban retreat for travellers with taste. The perfect place from which to explore Bogota & beyond...Head outside the city to Zipaquirá, home to a wondrous cathedral built inside a salt mine – one of Colombia's most compelling sights.



HOTEL CASA SAN AGUSTIN, Cartegna - There's a luxuriously chic and relaxed atmosphere at this authentic boutique hotel, which has held on to its colonial heritage within three beautiful white-washing houses. It's 20 guest rooms & 11 suites beautifully decorated preserve the authentic Colombian style, while seamlessly incorporates the modern services and amenities. From original frescoes at its Library to centuries-old wood-beamed ceilings in the guest rooms, Casa San Agustín's architecture evoke the city's rich history of the 17th century. In one of the houses is the rescued old aqueduct when Cartagena was only the walled city. Today is now the centrepiece of the Hotel Casa San Agustín, and it is where there splendid pool is located - one again, a true masterpiece of the ancient past of this fabulous city.

Each tent is equipped with King Sized bed, indoor desk & chair, private terrace with dining tables & chairs, individual subdivisions for toilette and for shower (hot water available upon request), vanity table with hand wash basin, towels, and mirrors, Electric lanterns and battery packs to recharge cameras and electronics. 





BEST TIME TO VISIT

- Colombia is a year round destination but the best time to travel is from December to March. As it is a tropical country you can get rain at any time however there tends to be two rainier seasons: from April to June and from September to October..
- The Sierra Nevada can be visited year-round but the cloud forest has two rainy seasons which generally run from May to June and from September to November. The best time to visit is between December and March which coincides with most other destinations within Colombia as best time to visit. It is worth noting that it can rain at any time of year due to the tropical climate!
- December to January is also the best season for those in search of optimum birdwatching as many migratory species return to the forest.
- When you think about carnivals in Latin America the first one that probably comes to your mind is Rio de Janeiro. However, it is not the only one! Thanks to the wide diversity of traditions in Colombia, there are plenty of festivals and carnivals every month of the year. To name 2 firm favs: At the beginning of February, Bogota hosts the Carnival of Barranquila. In August, Medellin there's the wonderful Festival de Flores (Flower Festival)
