Day 5 - The Alentejo Countryside



Learn the art of hand-harvesting, barrel aging, and modern innovations from your expert host - bringing the Douro's timeless craftsmanship vividly to life.


Day 9 - Flavours of the Douro: A Chef's Table Experience & 'Our Douro

You will be treated to a culinary experience like no other. As well as a guided visit to the Baron's private winery and taken on a guided walk of the vineyard, learning about the centuries old traditions. As well as that of the owner, Joseph James Forrester: the first foreigner to be awarded a Portuguese baronetcy.

Unwind in absolute exclusivity at the storied manor of the Baron of Forrester, nestled in the heart of the Douro Valley. Sip world-class wines as your private chef crafts exquisite dishes using hand-picked local ingredients - served against a backdrop of timeless beauty found in the perfectly lined vineyards.

Born to Scottish parents from Perth in 1809, this Englishman, due to his travels throughout the Douro meant that be came to be considered the person of his era with the most knowledge about the River and its wine! He went on to product two exceptional maps of the region, which still today have a lasting impact on the history & traditions of the Douro Valley.

Quinta da Boavista has been producing wine in the Douro since the first demarcation of this wine region, in 1756. The estate is clearly documented on these renowned maps from 1843 which were created by the owner of this winery: your man Joseph James Forrester himself! It's a day of culture, creativity and incredibly exclusive access.











Day 10 - Popping over to Porto

After a few action packed days, its time to relax. And take a leisurely journey with your private driver & guide through more of the Douro Valley direction Porto: your next & final stop on this odyssey. BEST TIME TO VISIT

- Portugal is blessed with a Mediterranean Climate & 300+ days of sunshine a year making it a year round destination. However, there certainly are some 'tricks of the trade' that we are Alician Travel know about that will ensure you are not engulfed by the crowds.
- Spring (March May). Best for mild weather, blooming landscapes & fewer crowds. The weather is pleasantly warm averaging 18-22 degrees Celsius (up to 75 Fahrenheit) in Lisbon. And slightly cooler in Douro Valley. Making it perfect to see the vineyards awakening in the Douro Valley as well the blankets of wildflowers emerging in the Alentejo Countryside. Easter is a time of festivals & celebrations in Portugal alongside the local markets bursting with fresh produce of the changing seasons.
- Summer (June August). Best for beaches, lively festivals and guaranteed sunshine. As you'd expect with it's Mediterranean location, summer bings hot & dry temperatures. Highs of 26-32 degrees Celsius (up to 95 Fahrenheit). Tends to be slightly cooler along the breezy coastline of Cascais & Algarve. Think vibrant parties with freshly grilled seafood awash with local Fado music. As well as the Algarve coastline glistening with yachts bopping in the ocean yonder. As you'd expect, peak time for crowds and likely higher hotel prices.
- Autumn (Sept-Nov). Best for wine lovers, gourmet experiences & golden sunsets. Not dissimilar weather to Spring. Highlight being the Grape Harvest Season in the Douro Valley. Perfect for hands on experience. Shoulder season makes for far less crowds & quieter in the key cities.
- Winter (Dec Feb). Best for fewer crowds & festive charm. Cold weather makes for wrapping up warm & getting into the festive Spirit! This is Portugal as it's quietest with minimal crowds and mainly the locals! Many attractions & sites still open so you can feel like you have the place to yourself! But don't expect the long sunny days of Autumn...it does rain in the north in Winter!
