Day 1 - Edinburgh Arrival & Afternoon Indulgence

- **Harry Potter Walking Tour** Follow in the footsteps of J.K. Rowling's inspirations for Hogwarts, Diagon Alley, and more.
- Chocolate-Making Workshop at The Chocolatarium A hands-on chocolate experience where kids (and adults) can craft their own delicious treats.


Day 3 - St Andrews & The fishing villages of Fife

- Private Full Day Chauffeur Guided Tour you'll be picked up at your hotel to be whisked off with you local driver guide to the glorious Kingdom of Fife. First stop being the beautiful town of St. Andrews; known globally as the 'home of golf'. Situated only 53 miles North East of Edinburgh; St Andrew is the patron Saint of Scotland, and according to legend his remains were washed up on the Fife coast. St Andrews is also home to the third oldest university in Britain and a beautiful ruined castle perched on a cliff. You have around two and a half hours to explore this fascinating town
- Onwards to Anstruther Next, having worked up an appetite, you will head back along the coastal route with a stop in the traditional fishing village of Anstruther (known as 'Ainster' locally), where you can check out the old cobbled streets and take a walk along the seafront to the harbour. Much like Prince William and his then girlfriend, now wife & future Queen of England, did so during their University days where they met at St Andrews University!
- Cruising the Coastal Fishing Villages of Fife There is also the option of
 enjoying a stop off at a the Local Whisky & Gin Distillery in Fife before cruising
 back along the coastline, dipping into the villages of Crail, Elie & Pittenweem.
 Before picking up on main road back over into Edinburgh with the chance to stop
 off and marvel at Loch Leven the site where Mary Queen of Scots was
 imprisoned in the 16th Century by her Protestant Nobility.

Day 5 - Loch Lomond & The Great Outdoors

- Private Boat Trip Along Loch Lomond Cruise along Scotland's largest freshwater loch, enjoying breathtaking views and stopping off at secluded islands when you can perhaps walk in the footsteps of your ancestors, or upon islands that remain uninhabited...and untouched by humans.
- **Guided Hiking Excursion** Explore the trails of the Loch Lomond and Trossachs National Park with a private guide, tailored to your fitness level and interests. - **Return Ferry Journey** End the day with a scenic ferry ride back to the mainland, soaking in the tranquil beauty of Scotland's west coast.

Day 8 - Journey along the West Highland Way to Isle of Skye

Day 10 - Follow in the footsteps of Outlander

- Falling first into the Falls of Dochart As your driver guide brings you back to reality post your the ethereal of Skye, you will cruise by the falls of Dochart at Killin before you cruise through the sleepy village of Callandar with a must do visit to see the Highland Coos (cows!)..
- Dipping into Doune Time to kick on up to Stirlingshire to visit Doune Castle: a medieval fortress just a stone's throw from the bustling town of Stirling. Once home to royalty and the scene of epic battles, the castle has centuries of history to be discovered, but these days it's probably most famous for being used as a filming location. You may not know but as well as being Castle Leoch in Outlander, Doune Castle has also featured as Winterfell in Game of Thrones? Not only that, the castle was also used in the legendary comedy Monty Python and the Holy Grail!
- Culminating in Culross No Outlander trip would be complete without a visit to Midhope Castle, the real-life setting for Lallybroch, home to the Fraser clan. Next you'll take in the stunning castle, Blackness, which is known as Fort William in the show. Because of its unique shape, the locals often call it "the ship that never sailed," but you'll know it better as the home of the infamous Black Jack Randall! From here you'll head through the impossibly quaint village of Culross: a picturesque, historic village in Fife, Scotland, known for its remarkably well-preserved 17th and 18th-century architecture and cobbled streets.













Day 11 - Final Hurrah & Farewell to Scotland
